When last season was shut down, the Swami was optimistic about a normal '20-'21 basketball season. The optimism quickly faded away, but the good news is that there is a '20-'21 basketball season. A very weird basketball season, but a basketball season nonetheless. Congratulations and thank you to the athletic directors, coaches, officials, administrators, and teams for their dedication, hard work, and willingness to adapt during a challenging time. It is mind boggling when one thinks

about all the schedule changes, the stops and starts, shutdowns, quarantines, and pauses. And just to top things off, why not throw in the biggest snowstorm in a number of years during the jam-packed final week of the regular season.

Thankfully, a large number of games from all around Northwest Ohio are being live streamed through various mediums. Not as good as being in the gym, but it will have to suffice for now. In Lucas County, a health order closed school buildings and shut down athletics and extracurricular activities in early December causing a number of teams to pause their season. will finish the regular season with a league tournament involving all eight members. No team in the Toledo City League played a game until January 15. The City League managed to play the entire double round league schedule (10 games per team) in just 22 days and will have their traditional final four to crown a league champion the last week of the regular season.

Now that the initial hysteria and finger pointing has subsided, the Swami is looking forward to seeing how the potential NLL expansion plays out. Given the known applicants and various statements, the Swami's take is that Slim just left town. The Swami is intrigued when media types refer to their unnamed sources. Games at the district tournament level will continue at neutral sites for 2021. Where the regional and state tournaments will be held is still unknown, but the OHSAA will get the word out immediately after we finish this.

It will be a challenge, but we can only hope that everyone stays healthy and the 2021 tournament moves forward with only some small bumps in the road. Time to disinfect the ouija board and go to the predictions while maintaining social distancing.

DIVISION I

Lake and Toledo Central Catholic are the sites for the D1 district tournaments formerly held at the University of Toledo. All eighteen teams were seeded and then assigned to one of the two districts based on whatever line on the brackets a team chose at the draw. Lima Senior was the overall top seed followed by Toledo St. John's Jesuit, Findlay, and Sylvania Northview. Lima Senior and Toledo Start own back-to-back district championships.

The winners of the two D1 districts will meet in a regional semifinal game at a site to be determined. The other regional semifinal will have two district winners from Northeast Ohio with Lakewood St. Edward and Cleveland St. Ignatius as the top contenders for those spots.

LAKE DISTRICT

Lima Senior, Sylvania Northview, Ashland, and Toledo Start are the top seeds. In what was supposed to be a "rebuilding" year, Lima Senior has clinched at least a share of the TRAC title. Lima's only losses to date came against Shelby and Lakewood St. Edward. The Spartans appear to have a clear path to the district final. Not to disrespect Perrysburg on the bottom half of the bracket, but the top half of the bracket appears to be much more interesting with Northview, Ashland, and Start. Northview's only losses were to St. John's and Perrysburg in mid-January while Start sits atop the TCL standings heading into their final four. Start did not play a game until January 15 but should finish their regular season having played at least seventeen games. Ashland is chasing Wooster for the top spot in the OCC. The Arrows will host Start in what should be an excellent sectional final.

TOLEDO CENTRAL CATHOLIC DISTRICT

Toledo St. John's Jesuit, Findlay, Sylvania Southview, and Anthony Wayne are the top seeds. St. John's remains in contention for a share of the TRAC title and will meet Lima Senior in their league matchup on the final Friday of the season. Findlay also could get a piece of the title, but will need help from the Johnnies. Findlay recently snapped Lima Shawnee's winning streak at forty-four games in the regular season and forty games overall. Both SJJ and Findlay have been playing well of late. Southview started the season with nine straight wins before back-to-back losses to Anthony Wayne and Lima Senior. Anthony Wayne is the top seed in the NLL tournament. Toledo St. Francis was the preseason favorite in the TRAC. The Knights have played a difficult schedule and are looking to salvage a disappointing season with a strong tournament showing.

DIVISION II

Lima Shawnee, Rossford, and Shelby are the top teams in D2 and favorites to win their respective districts. Shawnee and Rossford are currently ranked top five in the state according to the Associated Press. As mentioned previously, Shawnee had won forty-four straight regular season games and forty games overall before losing at Findlay in late January. Rossford began the season with nineteen straight wins before a loss at Cleveland St. Ignatius.

The district winner from Ashland will play the district winner from Spencerville in one regional semifinal game while the district winner from Lake will be playing the winner of one of the districts from Northeast Ohio in the other regional semifinal at a site (or sites) to be determined. State-ranked Akron Buchtel with one of the top juniors in the country in Chris Livingston is the top seed in the district out of Northeast Ohio.

LAKE DISTRICT

Rossford, Tiffin Columbian, Sandusky, and Toledo Central Catholic are the top seeds. Toledo Rogers is the defending district champion. Rossford is the clear-cut favorite with Tiffin Columbian their strongest competition. Rossford, the NBC champion, was attempting to complete their first undefeated regular season since '69-'70 when the Bulldogs were the Class AA state runner-up. The Bulldogs last won a district championship in 1989. Tiffin Columbian can still get a share of the SBC Lake title with Norwalk. Sandusky graduated all five starters from last season's district runnerup. A young Central Catholic team is the sleeper in the district despite a losing record. Toledo Scott finished a surprising 2nd place in the CL standings. The Bulldogs will play Start for the CL title. Rogers lost three starters to graduation and their two returning starters (Jamiya Neal and Stephen Coleman) opted to go to Hillcrest Prep in Arizona. The Rams were the pre-season favorite in the City League but have yet to jell.

ASHLAND DISTRICT

Shelby, Ontario, Norwalk, and Upper Sandusky are the top

seeds. The district was held at Mansfield Madison in 2020. Upper Sandusky is the defending district champion. This district is usually tough to predict with some wild finishes, but Shelby is the class of the field. The Whippets won their second straight MOAC championship. Shelby's losses have come against Wooster, Olentangy, and River Valley. Shelby last won a district title in 1999. The bottom half of the bracket looks very competitive with Ontario, Norwalk, Upper Sandusky, and Mansfield Senior. Coach Joe Balogh of Ontario is closing in on his 600th career win. The Warriors should finish as the MOAC runner-up. Norwalk will get at least a share of the SBC Lake title. The Truckers will be a tough out in the tournament with their defense. Upper jumped on Norwalk's bracket while Mansfield Senior also distanced themselves from Shelby. Huron is the highest seed on Shelby's side of the bracket.

SPENCERVILLE DISTRICT

Lima Shawnee, Wauseon, St. Marys, and Defiance are the top seeds. This district was held at Ohio Northern last season. This is the strongest of the districts in D2. Lima Shawnee has won back-to-back district championships. George Mangas scored a school-record 57 points for Shawnee in a February win over Trotwood-Madison. Wauseon hosts Archbold for the NWOAL title the final Friday of the regular season. Wauseon's losses are to

Perrysburg, Northview, and Rossford. St. Marys looked like Shawnee's biggest obstacle after playing the Indians tough in their WBL matchup, but the Roughriders have stumbled in the closing weeks. Defiance hosts Van Wert in an excellent sectional final matchup. Defiance has been solid in what was to be a rebuilding year. The Bulldogs and Van Wert have both been on a roll late in the season. Owen Treece broke the Van Wert individual game scoring record with 44 points against Columbus Grove in December.

DIVISION III

Colonel Crawford, Ottawa-Glandorf, and Western Reserve are the top D3 teams in Northwest Ohio with all making appearances in the Associated Press poll. Undefeated Colonel Crawford has been a fixture in the top five while Ottawa-Glandorf has remained in the top ten. Colonel Crawford and Western Reserve head up a very intriguing Shelby district. Ottawa-Glandorf once again is the team to beat in the Lima Senior district while Cardinal Stritch and Archbold are at the top of the Toledo Central Catholic district.

The district winner from Lima Senior will play the district winner from Toledo Central Catholic in one regional semifinal while the district winner from Shelby will meet one of the winners from the Central District in the other semifinal game at a site (or sites) to be determined. Johnstown-Monroe, North Union, and Columbus Africentric are the top seeds from the district heading our way out of Central Ohio. It is interesting to note that the overall top seeds in D3 from the Central District (Worthington Christian and Canal Winchester) chose a path leading to a potential district final showdown that will put the winner against teams from the Southeast and East Districts in the regional.

LIMA SENIOR DISTRICT

Ottawa-Glandorf, Wayne Trace, Lima Central Catholic, and Coldwater are the top seeds. Ottawa-Glandorf is the defending district champion. O-G may have four losses (Lima Central Catholic, Lima Shawnee, Rossford and Van Wert), but it would still be an upset if the Titans do not win the district. The Titans returned two starters from last year's team. O-G has won sectional titles the past fifteen seasons. A young Wayne Trace team has been somewhat of a surprise. The Raiders handed Antwerp their only loss finishing in 2nd place in the GMC behind the Archers. LCC has been solid playing a difficult schedule. Coldwater, Fairview, Riverdale, Liberty-Benton, and Lima Bath are all hovering around the .500 mark. Bath is much improved from a season ago. Riverdale and L-B are part of the fiveteam mess at the top of the BVC standings. Bluffton tied the state record with twenty-five made 3's in their 101-46 win over Cory-Rawson in mid-January.

TOLEDO CENTRAL CATHOLIC DISTRICT

Cardinal Stritch, Archbold, Evergreen, and Ottawa Hills are the top seeds. Evergreen is the defending district champion. This district should come down to the contrasting styles of Stritch and Archbold. Stritch's last loss was in overtime at Willard ending a stretch of four losses in the first five games for the Cardinals. Jhaiden Wilson of Stritch scored a school record 48 points in a win at Kenton. Archbold also got off to somewhat of a slow start, but the Blue Streaks turned it around in late December. Archbold is on a collision course with Wauseon for the outright NWOAL title. Evergreen started the season with nine straight wins. This is a typical Ottawa Hills team with the whole being greater than the sum of the parts. The Green Bears got off to a late start not playing a game until mid-January. Swanton, Eastwood, and Liberty Center are all having solid seasons. Eastwood will finish as the runner-up to Rossford in the NBC. Northwood and Maumee Valley Country Day had only played six games and seven games respectively at the time of the draw.

SHELBY DISTRICT

Colonel Crawford, Western Reserve, Willard, and Oak Harbor are the top seeds. The district was held at Norwalk in 2020. Colonel Crawford is the defending district champion. This has the potential to be a really fun district. Crawford is the N10 champion. The Eagles are gunning for their first undefeated regular season since the '62-'63 team that lost in a district semifinal to Attica (thanks to Andrew Ebbeskotte and crawfordcountybasketball.com). Colonel Crawford has won nine straight sectional titles. Western Reserve is the Firelands champion marking their 4th straight title. WR had a fifteen-game winning streak with their only losses at Crawford in November and at Toledo Christian in February. Willard has clinched at least a share of the SBC Bay title. Both of Willard's league losses to date came at the hands of



Oak Harbor. The Rockets still have a chance at a piece of the SBC Bay but need help. Ashland Crestview and Woodmore are both having solid seasons. The two along with Oak Harbor are all in the same bracket with Woodmore having won at OH back in December.

DIVISION IV

To the surprise of no one, D4 basketball around Northwest Ohio remains pretty, pretty, pretty good in 2021. Antwerp is the top-ranked D4 team in Ohio according to the Associated Press. The Archers are joined by Ottoville and Columbus Grove in the top five. Toledo Christian was in the top ten for the majority of the weeks before finishing in the 11th spot. Not to digress, but it is mystifying (first time that word has been used in twenty-eight years) that the Toledo Blade gave New Boston Glenwood (from Southeastern Ohio) their first-place vote in the February 8 poll. We hope it was only a momentary lapse of judgment.

Winners from four of the districts (Defiance, Elida, Liberty-Benton, Wapakoneta) will remain in Northwest Ohio for regional tournament games. The district winner from Liberty-Benton will play the district winner from Elida in one regional semifinal game, and the district winner from Wapakoneta will meet the district winner from Defiance at the always popular site (or sites) to be determined. The district winner from Willard will meet one of the district winners from Northeast Ohio in a regional semifinal at you guessed it. Top seeds in that district are McDonald and Warren JFK. The other semifinal game in the D4 regional to the east will match the two other D4 district winners from Northeast Ohio. Richmond Heights once again is the team to beat from Northeast Ohio.

WILLARD DISTRICT

South Central, Margaretta, Norwalk St. Paul, and Sandusky St. Mary are the top seeds. Lucas is the defending district champion. This should be a really entertaining district with five teams having a chance to win it. South Central and Norwalk St. Paul are in a battle for the runner-up spot in the Firelands behind Western Reserve. St. Paul swept the two regular season meetings. Seniors Nick and Nate Winslow of St. Paul both went over 1,000 career points this season. Margaretta can still gain a share of the SBC Bay title. Junior Jake Leibacher of the Polar Bears scored a school-record 45 points in a January win over Edison. Sandusky St. Mary is

the hardest team to figure in this group. The Swami is surprised that SMCC was seeded higher than Lucas. The Cubs are the MBC champion for a third straight season. Riley Gossom, the top returning player for Lucas, has basically missed the entire season after being injured in an automobile accident. Monroeville could be a spoiler. Junior Isaac Roeder became Monroeville's career scoring leader in a February win over Ashland Crestview.

A very solid district with nine of the fourteen teams at or above .500 at the time of the draw. Old Fort and Calvert are currently tied for the lead in the SBC River. Old Fort took the two regular season meetings with the Senecas by a total of three points. The Stockaders last won a district title in 2002. Carey is chasing Upper Sandusky for the runner-up spot behind Colonel Crawford in the N10 with Mohawk close behind. Fremont St. Joseph will finish in the top half of the River. Blake

Michael of SJCC became the school's career scoring leader in a February win over Lakota. Arlington fell out of BVC title contention during the final week. The Red Devils could only garner the #7 seed. Hopewell-Loudon owns a win over Old Fort but has been slowed by late season injuries. Hardin Northern will finish the season with a winning

record. The Polar Bears have not finished a season over the .500 mark since the '03-'04 team went 12-9 as a member of the BVC.

ELIDA DISTRICT

Columbus Grove, Ottoville, Convoy Crestview, and Kalida are the top seeds. Columbus Grove owns back-to-back district championships. This is the best D4 district in the state. Columbus Grove returned four starters from last season's undefeated team. Grove has clinched at least a share of the NWC title. Bulldog losses came against Ottoville and Jackson Center. Blake Reynolds became Columbus Grove's career scoring leader back in December. Ottoville is the PCL champion. The Big Green's only losses were in December to Antwerp and Lincolnview. Josh Thorbahn became Ottoville's career scoring leader scoring a school-record 45 points in a February win over Toledo Rogers. Crestview with OSU recruit Kalen Etzler is right behind Columbus Grove in the NWC standings. Kalida started the season with nine straight wins and were as high as 2nd in the state poll before losing at Crestview. Lincolnview resides in 3rd place in the NWC. The Lancers started the season 10-2 and made several appearances in the state poll. Leipsic started the season 11-1. The Vikings were recently eliminated from BVC title contention. Cory-Rawson and Pandora-Gilboa still remain in contention in the BVC.

Commodore losses came at the hands of the Lima's (Shawnee, Central Catholic, Bath). Minster went undefeated in MAC play giving the Wildcats their first outright conference title. Perry beat Minster by two points in a game at Perry back in mid-January. St. Henry currently holds the runner-up spot in the MAC followed by New Bremen, Marion Local, and Fort Recovery. Upper Scioto Valley will finish in a tie for 2nd place in the NWCC. Ridgemont will finish the season with a winning record.

That will give the Golden Gophers back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in thirty-four years. Parkway returned two starters from last season's regional finalist, but the Panthers will need to play the role of spoiler in this year's tournament. New Knoxville ended a 30-game MAC losing streak with a January win over Delphos St. John's.

Antwerp, Toledo Christian, Pettisville, and Aversville are the top seeds. Antwerp is the defending district champion. Antwerp's only loss to date was at home on a buzzer-beater to Wayne Trace in mid-January. The Archers are the GMC champions. Antwerp has wins over state-ranked Ottoville and Botkins. Toledo Christian will finish behind Cardinal Stritch in the TAAC. The Eagles have played a strong schedule. TC's Trevor Wensink and Cole McWhinnie both scored their 1,000th career point in a December win at Ayersville. Pettisville has clinched at least a share of the BBC title for the fourth straight year.
